# NAFA FOUNDATION PROGRAMME (NFP)

#### **EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS**

Secondary 4 Normal (Academic) students who attained an ELMAB3 (English Language, Mathematics, Best 3 other subjects) aggregate score of 15 points or better, excluding CCA Bonus Points. If you score 4 and above in English Language, you will be required to attend an interview.

# **DIPLOMA**

#### **EDUCATIONAL QUALIFICATIONS**

- Singapore-Cambridge GCE O-Level: Aggregate score of 25 points or better in 4 GCE O-Level subjects, excluding English. Applicants who are active in their Secondary Schools' Co-curricular Activities (CCA) may gain up to 2 CCA points. The CCA points can be used to improve their EQ aggregate score for admission consideration.
- Singapore Integrated Programme or SOTA Year 4
- Institute of Technical Education (ITE):
  - Full-time Higher NITEC or NITEC
  - Part-time ITE certificate, with a minimum GPA of ≥ 2.0 for Higher NITEC holders or ≥ 3.5 for NITEC holders
- International Students: Completed at least ten years of education

#### LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY

## **English Proficiency**

GCE O-Level Grade C6 / TOEFL iBT 50 / IELTS Academic Band 5 / SAT score of 480 (Evidence-Based Reading & Writing component) / Duolingo score of 80 / Pearson Test of English Academic score of 42. Applicants with Higher NITEC or NITEC qualifications are deemed to have met the English Language proficiency requirement.

## **Mandarin Proficiency**

Applicants for Diploma in Theatre (Mandarin Drama) will need the following: GCE O-Level Grade C6 in Chinese Language or Higher Chinese or Literature in Chinese.

# PORTFOLIO / ADMISSION TEST / AUDITION REQUIREMENTS (NFP AND DIPLOMA)

## ▲ Art & Design

Submit a portfolio of 10-15 images of recent art / design work or take an admission test.

# Option 1. Portfolio Submission

You are to submit 10-15 images of recent art or design work, which should include a range of finished artwork as well as development work in preparing the finished artwork (sketches, mood boards, etc). The work submitted should preferably be not more than two years old.

Your portfolio should contain your original works from at least two of the following categories: paintings, drawings, collages, posters, sculptures, digital images (Photoshop, Illustrator, etc), photographs, and/or video clips.

You are also expected to write a statement of intent - in about 100 words - stating your reasons for pursuing a programme of study in art and design. Please include your goals, interests and aspirations for the future.

#### Option 2.

#### **Admission Test consists of three sections:**

- Written ability: Ability to express and rationalise in writing
- Drawing from observation: Ability to draw from observation
- (Diploma only) Creative visualisation: Aptitude in creativity and visualisation

#### ▲ Arts Management

Submit a 500-word personal statement. A testimonial is optional.

Your personal statement should articulate your interest for the arts and future career goals.

## ■ Dance

Perform in an audition and participate in an interview.

#### **Practical Assessment**

You are expected to prepare and perform two contrasting solos of any dance genre/style (e.g. Ballet and Cultural Dance; Chinese classical dance and Chinese folk dance). Each dance should not exceed 90 seconds. The solo dance can be choreographed by yourself or by someone else (e.g. your dance teacher).

#### Interview

You are expected to discuss why you want to study dance during the interview.

#### ▲ Theatre

Perform an audition monologue, participate in a workshop and an interview.

#### **Audition Monologue**

During the audition, you will be asked to perform one of the three pieces of dramatic texts. You are expected to arrive with your chosen monologue memorised.

#### Workshop

You are expected to participate enthusiastically in the improvisation exercises and theatre games during the workshop.

#### Interview

You are expected to discuss why you want to study theatre during the interview.

#### ■ Music

Perform in an audition and participate in a brief interview. Composers are required to submit a portfolio of two to five compositions.

#### **Audition (approximately 15 minutes)**

- Performance of two contrasting works of your choice.
   Pieces selected from popular music repertoire would not be considered for the purposes of this audition.
- Sight-reading
- Aural awareness
- Music theory test\*
- Short interview with the audition panel about your musical experiences, interests and your ambitions for future studies and career.

\*Applicants will be exempted from the music theory test if they present any of the following documentary evidence:

- ABRSM Grade V Music Theory or its equivalent
- Pass in GCE O-Level or GCE A-Level Music
- Pass in SOTA Music Year 4 and above
- Pass in Music Theory subject in a specialist music school

#### **Portfolio Submission**

- Statement of Intent which communicates your purpose in pursuing the programme: 250 to 300 words for Biophilic Design and Design Practice or 500 words for Fine Art.
- Submit a Portfolio of your best works: 10-15 pieces of your best works for Biophilic Design and Design Practice or 5 for Fine Art. These works should demonstrate creativity, passion, and curiosity and reflect your skills and study in the respective discipline.
- If you are applying for Fine Art, you should also submit a 3-minute self-introductory video.
- Attend a group interview session where you are expected to communicate your motivations in applying for the programme and share your views on specific topics given.

## ▲ BA (Hons) Performance Making

#### **Audition Requirements**

- Solo Mandarin monologue (Contemporary Chinese Theatres)
  - You are expected to perform a Mandarin monologue that you have learnt by heart, taken from a published playtext (2–3 minutes).
- Solo Performance (Performance Making)
  - You are expected to perform a monologue that has been learnt by heart, taken from a published playtext (2-3 minutes), or a dance solo (1.5 minutes) choreographed either by you or by someone else.
- Workshop: You are expected to participate fully in the interactive workshop.
- Interview: You are expected to discuss why you want to study the programme during the interview and share any relevant experience.

#### **Audition Requirements**

- Performance and Interview (for Instrumentalists/Vocalists)
  - You are required to prepare a programme and show a variety of styles, periods and characters. You do not need to submit your audition programme in advance.
     The audition panel reserves the right to hear only part of the programme overall.
  - Vocalists are expected to prepare three contrasting pieces in at least three of the following languages:
     English, Italian, French, and German. One piece must be an operatic or oratorio aria (with recitative if possible).
     Pieces selected from popular music (such as Pop songs) and works from musical theatre repertoire will not be considered for the purposes of this audition.
- Portfolio Submission and Interview (for Composers and Bachelor of Music (Hons))
  - Composers are expected to submit a portfolio of at least two, but not more than five, contrasting examples of your compositions.

# For Bachelor of Education (Hons) in Instrumental & Vocal Teaching Applicants only

You are required to submit a personal statement (250-300 words).

#### **Audition Requirements**

**Master of Composition:** Submit a portfolio of at least two, but no more than five, contrasting examples of your compositions, a personal statement (250 – 300 words) and attend an interview.

**Master of Performance:** Submit a personal statement (250 – 300 words) and attend an audition and interview.

#### **Keyboard Studies**

Piano applicants should prepare a varied programme of at least 50 minutes and must include an advanced étude.

#### Strings Studies

String instrumental applicants should prepare all of the following:

- one significant movement from a concerto composed after 1800
- a contrasting piece of your choice

### Winds Studies and Percussion Studies

Brass, woodwind and percussion applicants should prepare a programme of two contrasting pieces at a standard reflective of your artistry, expressive and technical competency.

### **Chinese Instrumental Studies**

Chinese instrument applicants should prepare all of the following:

- One significant movement of a concerto, or a work written originally for the solo instrument and orchestra (一首协奏曲)
- A chuan tong piece from standard repertoire (一首传统乐曲)
- A piece written after 1970 (一首创作乐曲 (1970年后))

#### ▲ Master of Fine Arts Fine Art

#### Portfolio and Interview

- Research proposal (800 1000 words): The proposal requires applicants to identify the area of art practice that they intend to focus and develop during their study period, and their artistic position upon graduation.
- 2. Personal statement (400 500 words)
- Portfolio submission: The applicant's portfolio should contain artworks documented in digital format (up to 15 images and/or 10 minutes of moving images or sound work).
- 4. Reference letters: Applicants will need to register two referees who can give an informed view of their academic ability and suitability for the course.
- 5. Attend an interview
